The reason I needed to visit this establishment was that my clutch master cylinder was on the way out again, As its been rekitted several times I thought it was time I got a new cylinder. While I was there I got the following information,

This list supersedes all previous lists published. (August 2000) I have copied this direct from the Bendix Catalogue. I would question the reference to the 2.5 D - 1986 - 1988. If this is the ALTER I then is the braking system the same as the TRANSCAT and not the ALTER II.

### Short Shift Shaft Shot.

Having broken the gear lever several times in both my ALTER IIs over the years. I have always removed it through the round hole in the floor, Not easy but it can be done.

But this time when I ended up with only two gears (3rd & 4th) I initially thought the base ring of the gear lever had come away. When I got underneath to have a look (Luckily enough I still had the gear box sound deadening cover off after it caught fire back in August.) I found that part of the linkage had broken off further back underneath so the whole linkage had to come off.

To start with inside remove the gear knob and the gear lever gaiter. Then laying under the left hand side of the vehicle, If you look upwards towards the top of the gear box you will see the gear linkage comprising of a rocker shaft that runs along the top left hand side of the gear box.

At the front of the rocker shaft there is an arm that drops down from the gear lever, This is connected to the gear box via two ball joints.

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Disconnect the rear one (Spring clip and slid it off.)

To the rear of the rocker shaft there is another short arm that is connected to the rear of the gear box by another drop arm with two ball joints.

(pop off the lower one with a screwdriver.)

It was the short arm on the cross shaft that had broken off and this is the link that provides cross box selection.

On the rear end of the rocker shaft there is a rubber bush with a stud through it secured with a M8 nylock mut.

Undo the nut with a 13mm spanner and pull the rocker shaft off the stud.

The front of the rocker shaft is supported in another rubber mount.

With the rocker shaft off the stud rock the rocker shaft and pull it back wards, This will disengage it from the front mount.

Now pull the whole assembly down and out of the hole in the floor.

After I had managed to jig the arm up in the vice for welding the whole assembly was put back in place in reverse order as they say.

#### Letters.

Dear Graham.

Just an update as I've now had my UMM for six months and I thought you would like to know how things are going.

Firstly cylinder head needed changing after head gasket problems we discovered that the cylinder head had no less than 5 cracks.

After a quick phone call to Brian Granger ( County Vehicle Services ) he managed to get me a New / recon cylinder head within 24 hours at a cost of £500.

My local garage fitted it after winging and moaning for 7.581 but what a difference.

As I was running on 3 cylinders for a long period of time (many thanks to Brian.)

Also I have changed the bottom joint and a new clutch slave cylinder yet again Brian came to the rescue.

Vehicle is now mechanically sound and successfully towed 3 ton of trailer at a steady 65. M.P.H.

Very impressed with the vehicle in general after owing many Solihull Products. I have now done some cosmetics.

Painted the roof body colour (red) after many people asking me whether it was a chopped Land Rover. (feed up with being insulted.)

Also changed wheels & tyres to 30 x 9.50 x 15 this has made a remarkable difference to the steering and handling and is extremely good off road.

With a greater wheel off set the overall appearance of the vehicle looks better.

I now have an access ladder which hooks on to the roof gutter and bolts at the bottom this is a perfect fit and is a Land Rover part.

Also I fitted a Land Rover 110 Grey Vynal cubby box between the two front seats which completes the front interior and is very useful.

Needed a new exhaust,

From MR EXHAUST. EAST GRINSTEAD. WEST SUSSEX They made me an almost complete exhaust for  $\pounds 200$ .





# CHANGE OF VENUE ... YET AGAIN ! (British Army comes to the rescue)

- 1<sup>st</sup> Last year Weston Park near Telford, Shropshire. Forced to move the 4x4 show due to a massive pop concert (V `99) taking priority. Coincidentally, within days asked to host *Europa Truck-Trial* in year 2000.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Early this year new venue found High Weald Valley, West Sussex. Following protests by <u>two</u> residents over access, forced to move new *Wheels 'n' Tracks 2000* show before local council issued a total ban.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Five weeks to go, a major decision. Either abandon event this year or find a new venue. Incredibly new venue found almost instantly. Moved 20 miles up the road to Willinghurst Estate near Cranleigh, Surrey (just south of Guildford). Despite it being a private, 1000 acre estate with virtually no residents and excellent access, the local council was again up in arms threatening the event with imminent closure. "Event too large", "not suitable for the local community", etc. Only two weeks left and <u>no venue</u>!

4<sup>th</sup>

Enter the British Army. Now, with only 10 days to go, the event has moved yet again to an excellent new location on Ministry of Defence land (close to the A3) known as Broxhead Common, near Bordon, Hampshire.



Let it be known that without the Army's valuable assistance and that of Hants & Berks Rover Owners Club, *Wheels 'n' Tracks 2000* would <u>definitely have been cancelled</u>. As it stands, sited only 18 miles west from the previous location, we once again have a venue for trade stands, camping, etc. (this is the same location as used by Hants & Berks ROC recently for the ARC 2000 International Rally) and <u>no access problems</u>. The *Europa Truck-Trial* will now take place on Army tank-training grounds whilst the public Scenic Route on Broxhead Common will suit all types of driver and vehicle from novices to experienced off-roaders.

So, sorry about the upheaval, but at least this way it avoids a lot of folk being very, very disappointed. Should however any pre-booked trader or camper find themselves unable to attend, a full refund is available on request.
